Town and Country Hanging Requirements for 2023

This most popular venue for our art sales has new hanging requirements for 2023. After having several paintings fall off the walls, one striking a customer it is important that we make sure we are hanging art in accordance with Town & Country’s wishes. Town and Country wants us to use Command Strips. The new requirements may mean that we will not be able to hang as many paintings. The requirements are as follows:

Framed art must use “command Strips”, correctly applied for the hanging weight. This will be confirmed before signing work into the Red log book.

No glass will be allowed on framed art, however thin Plexiglas is allowed with the proper weight “Command Strip” correctly applied. This will be confirmed.

Eyehooks and hanging wire may only be attached to the inside back of the frame. The eyehooks must not project from the back of the frame, in other words, they cannot touch the wall.

Only two people will be removing and hanging work when the show is changed out. Members are needed to help carry paintings upstairs and make sure paintings are properly logged in and out.
