THE ARTIST BLUES Part I

"I think I won't paint for a while."

"Why do I keep up with my art when it's so frustrating?"

"When will I create a painting that I'm thoroughly happy with?"

If any of these thoughts apply to you, read on. Call it "Artist's Blues". Evidently it befalls some painters on a regular basis. I wouldn't be surprised if the likes of Picasso, da Vince, Van Gogh and Rafael experienced a few moments when thoughts of "Why do I try?" filled their talented heads. I'll confess that lately, such thoughts have entered my own mind once or twice. You may recognize the symptoms: you enter your "studio," spy the brushes, and wince. Maybe you're not inspired that day, and your list of possible subjects is down to zero.

Now, I don't mean to be Sally Raincloud here; this malady may visit some of us off and on, but there's always that perennial light at the end of.....you know. So before you decide to take up purse design or amateur radio instead, remember that all endeavors have their highs and lows.

One artist told me that she only paints when the inspiration hits her, rather than feeling she *has to* turn out one finished work per week or per month. I remember being inspired to pick up my paints and brushes again after taking an art class at Parks and Rec that really filled me with fresh enthusiasm, or after going on a trip and bringing home some interesting photos that seemed to be crying to be rendered in paint.

I read art books, and a couple of authors have bared their souls about painter's block and how to cure it, so I'll share some suggested remedies next month.
