Feb. 21, 2024 – Make your own Concertina Sketchbook

Judy Guttormsen will demonstrate how to "Make Your Own Concertina Sketchbook". A concertina sketchbook is a sketchbook that is bound in a non-traditional way so that there is effectively just one long page that is folded like an accordion into a sketchbook size. They can be enjoyed as one long work of art or they can be paged through like a traditional sketchbook.

March 20, 2024-Collage

Bring in torn up used paper, tissue paper, old water color art (to be torn up) wrapping paper etc. Set up a still life in the room to create from these scrapes from the past. We would need to bring our craft glue and a panel or paper to create from. This will be fun.

A Fellow Art League.... Port Ludlow Art League

Our new member, Janie Easley Ballard, is also a member of the Port Ludlow Art League. We have asked her to give us some ideas of how another art league does things. Here are her notes:

- 1. PLAL annual dues are \$40 (you can get the membership application on the website and mail in a check)
- 2. PLAL has a non-profit status
- 3. Artist demonstrations are paid \$100
- 4. Meetings are held on the 3 rd Wednesday of each month from 1-3pm.
- a. They are started with a meeting and then the demo is from about 2-3pm.
- b. Our meetings are regularly advertised and guests are invited to attend. The Membership board member greets everyone at the entrance, has them sign in, gives members their name tags, collects \$5 from guests and gives guests a blank name tag to put their name on. This is a good way to increase membership.
- c. Coffee and goodies are provided (one of the Board members coordinates volunteers to bring goodies and the coffee is provided).

The meetings are held 6 months at the Bay Club and 6 months at the Beach Club.

- 5. The PLAL has a Gallery. It is a room right next to the Sound Community Bank in PL. The bank has let us use this space for our Gallery for many years at no charge! It has its own entrance. There is a Board member in charge of the Gallery (Gallery Manager). She changes out the artwork every 2 months. Members provide her with information for labels and she prints them all out ahead of time (so the labels all look alike). It is very nicely done. We have wall art, a note card rack, print rack, ceramics, textiles, woodwork, lavender, jewelry, pine needle baskets, etc. You are all welcome to come and visit us! It is located at 9500 Oak Bay Road, Port Ludlow. The current hours are Tuesday-Friday Noon-4pm. Members have to pay \$5 a month advertising fee and work in the Gallery once every 1-2 months. Members collect their own sales tax (it is included in each price). Currently we do not have the means to take a credit/debit card. The customers can go next door at the bank to get cash. As sales are made, a 3-copy receipt is written 1 copy to buyer, 1 copy to artist, 1 copy in book. The artist's money is put in their file and a phone call if made to the artist to let them know they have money YEAH! Love those sales □ We have an Artist & Jeweler of the Month who displays their artwork inside the bank, with special advertisement for them.
- 6. We currently have 4 Art Fairs a year:
- a. Spring Art Fair at the Bay Club Memorial Day
- b. Port Ludlow Performing Arts Art Fair on lawn in front of the PL Inn Summer
- c. Labor Day Art Fair on lawn in front of the PL Inn September
- d. Holiday Art Fair at the Beach Club, November 25 th , Saturday this year –PLEASE COME!
- 7. Merchant Exhibits
- a. Beach Club
- b. Bay Club
- c. Coldwell Banker Realty
- d. Post Office
- e. Active Life Physical Therapy
